A meeting of the Board of Directors of the Washington Township Health Care District was held on Wednesday, April 10, 2013 in the Conrad E. Anderson, MD Auditorium, 2500 Mowry Avenue, Fremont, California. Director Nicholson called the meeting to order at 6:03p.m. and led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Ms. Farber introduced Kimberlee Alvari, Director, Food and Nutrition Services who presented on Prescription for Nutrition Healing: Automation of the Food Delivery System. Ms. Alvari began by sharing the mission of the dietary office: "patients come first, every patient, every time." She discussed the complexities of nutrition for the hospitalized patient and discussed the current dietary office operation. Ms. Alvari explained CBORD, a web based mobile meal ordering application, was selected as a Room Service operation to automate the dietary office, improve patient safety, increase patient satisfaction, improve nutritional status, support an efficient work process, and control food costs and materials. The CBORD dietary automation service will provide patients with individualized menu options based on traits and preferences including cultural and religious, specific menu selections, and personalized customer service. Ms. Alvari concluded by reviewing the benefits of CBORD automation that support the "Patient First" ethic at Washington Hospital.

EDUCATION SESSION: "Prescription for Nutrition Healing: Automation of the Food Delivery System"

Ms. Farber introduced Chris Henry, Chief Financial Officer, who discussed patient Observation Status. Mr. Henry explained "Observation" according to Medicare is when a patient is stable, does not meet acute care criteria, and meets another qualifying set of criteria requiring further observation within 24 hours or less. Mr. Henry reviewed a list of general indications for an extended "observation" stay of 24 to 48 hours. Mr. Henry described three possible patient scenarios and discussed the patient financial responsibility for each scenario.

Ms. Farber introduced Stephanie Williams, RN, Chief Nursing Officer, who presented the Intensivist Program: 2012 Annual Report. Ms. Williams explained the Intensivists are physicians who direct and provide medical care in a hospital's Intensive Care Unit (ICU), working with the attending physician of record and the multidisciplinary team. Ms. Williams discussed the Intensivist program objectives, ICU initiatives, provided an overview of delirium, delirium objectives, nutritional assessment in ICU, and the family assistance program. Ms Williams presented the 2012 results of the program in the areas of ventilator associated pneumonia, nosocomial MRSA, ICU mortality, and median number of critical days in CCU. Ms. Williams concluded her presentation reviewing continued objectives in 2013.

QUALITY REPORT "Intensivist Program: 2012 Annual Report"

Chris Henry, Chief Financial Officer, presented the Finance Report for February. The average daily census was 185.8 with admissions of 942 resulting in 5,201 patient days. Outpatient observation equivalent days resulted in 277. The average length of stay was 5.35 days. The case mix index was 1.539. Deliveries were 153. Surgical cases were 348. Joint Replacement cases were 116. Neurosurgical cases were 14. Cardiac Surgical cases were 11. PTCA procedures were 44, and the Outpatient visits were 7,581. Total productive FTEs were 1,354.6. FTEs per adjusted occupied bed were 6.20.

FINANCE REPORT

Ms. Farber presented the Hospital Operations Report for March. There were 989 admissions with 5,474 days of care or an average daily census of 177. Preliminary information indicated inpatient revenue for the month at approximately \$135,732,000; 53.5% was Medicare and 9.8% was Medi-Cal, or a total of 63.3% in government program revenue. There were 162 deliveries in the Hospital. There were 355 surgical cases at the Hospital and 569 cases at the Surgery Center. There were 371 heart cases including 34 PTCAs. The Emergency Room saw 4,558 patients. The clinics saw approximately 3,647 patients. FTEs per Adjusted Occupied Bed were 6.33.
